Why work with us?

You want to leave a legacy that will last. We manage and publicize more than 50 separate named funds. The names and goals of these funds live forever through the power of endowment.

You want to help future generations. We will always be here making the area a better place for your children and grandchildren. We won't ever leave, go out of business, or retire.

You want ongoing advice about community. We are the largest grant maker and scholarship provider in Russell County. We know our area, its issues and its nonprofits better than any other organization and can help you be a part of solving community challenges.

You want to give to a cause, not a specific charity. Sometimes you know the issue you care about—the arts, animal welfare, children, the hungry—but you don't want to give to a specific organization. We can find initiatives and organizations in your chosen discipline and support them *in your name*.

You have a complicated financial transaction, e.g., the sale of a privately-owned business or an inheritance that could impact your tax status. As a public charity, we can receive your gifts now while allowing time to plan for your charitable distribution.

Charitable Bequests: Start Building Your Legacy Now

Charitable bequests are the most frequent type of planned gift made to charity. They can be created with different types of assets including land, retirement assets, or insurance. The estate receives a charitable deduction for the full amount given, so heirs pay no estate tax on the gift.

Charitable bequests are a great way to build your legacy at the Foundation while still maintaining control of needed assets during your lifetime. A bequest may be made to the Foundation in several different ways:

- . Gift a percentage of your estate
- . Gift of a specific dollar amount or asset
- . Gift from the balance or residue of your estate

3 Steps to a Bequest

- 1. Update your will, trust or beneficiary designation to the Russell County Area Community Foundation. We can provide your professional advisor with recommended language to make this a seamless process.
- 2. Determine your charitable legacy— education, your church, the arts, human services, etc... The options are endless.
- Contact the Foundation to fill out a Fund for the Future fund agreement. This simple two page agreement can be revised over the years through our office without any attorney or court fees.

Fund for a Better Russell County Area

This unrestricted grant fund allows the Foundation the flexibility to meet current community needs. Grants are awarded throughout the year through a competitive grant process. Since inception, the Russell County Area Community Foundation has awarded more than \$54,000 in grants from this fund.

Funding for this grant program comes from donations, memorials, and other gifts to the Russell County Area Community Foundation. Gifts of any size are welcome additions to this important community grant fund and will help earn a 50% match from the Kansas Health Foundation's GROW II matching grant program.

Investment Info

The Foundation believes the best longterm performance will be achieved through a balanced portfolio consisting of 75% equities and 25% fixed income and cash.

As an affiliate of the **Greater Salina** Community Foundation (GSCF), the funds at the Russell **County Area Community Foundation are** pooled with all the funds held by GSCF and its affiliates. The funds are invested with Vanguard and governed by a local **Finance Committee** at GSCF.

We are confident in our performance and rate well when compared to other investment pools.

Our 5 year annualized return is 1.71%, which rates higher than the 75% S&P 500 Stock Index + 25% Barclays Intermediate Bond Index of 1.67%.





RCACF Assets by Type




RCACF Total Assets
